

## *Dual (College) Credit Opportunities At Phoenix High School*

### How did this come about?

The university considers the curriculum and learning outcomes of Phoenix HS courses, as well as our teachers background. It then considers two questions: (1) do students in the Phoenix HS course learn material which meets or exceeds what students at the university would learn, and (2) is the instructor qualified to be considered for a teaching position at the university. If the answer is 'Yes' to both questions, they are willing to offer their university credit to our students.

### How common is this?

The opportunity to earn college academic credit for college-level work done in the high school classroom is very common throughout the United States. There are many professional studies which speak to the benefits of this.

### What are among the advantages of earning early college credit?

There are several advantages to earning college credit while in high school:

- Students are taking advanced coursework and gaining college-ready skills.
- These college credits earned while in high school are at a reduced tuition rate, so families can save money with each course successfully completed. Put another way: if a student earns a years-worth of college credit while in high school at this reduced tuition, they only have three years remaining in college at normal full tuition. It could be a significant savings for families.
- Strong collegiate grades will prove beneficial when applying for colleges, especially for schools which are competitive to get entry to.
- Students can enhance their job resume by putting the college on it.
- Employment earnings often increase with more college experience.
- Students can complete the Oregon Transfer Module and significant portions of RCC pre-professional certificates

### Tuition?

For the 2017-2018 school year, a four-credit course from Southern Oregon University cost only \$172 (it costs over \$900 if on-site at the university). Credits from Rogue Community College and Klamath Community College are free.

### Are the credits transferable?

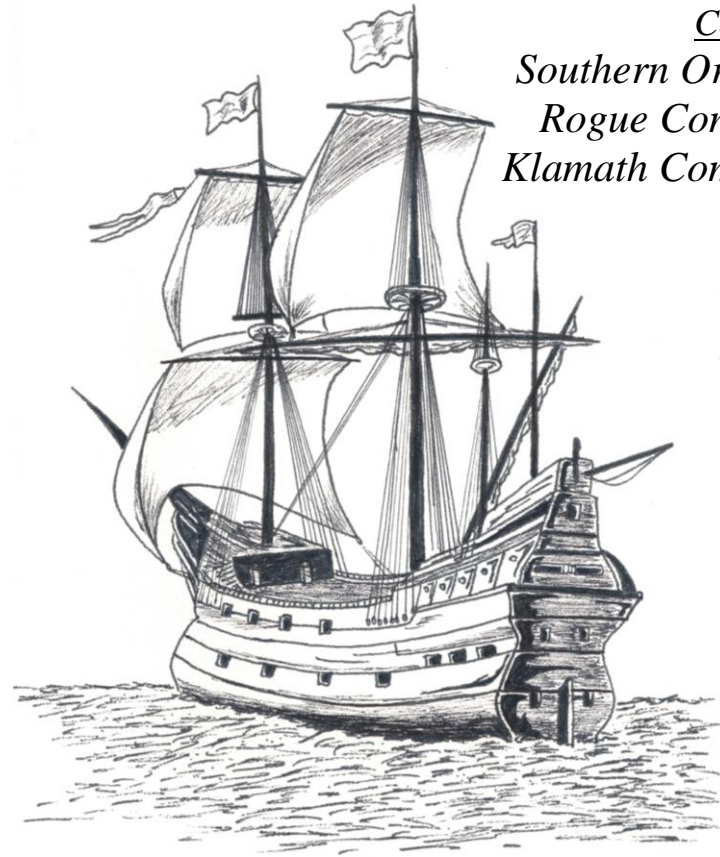
A vast majority of these credits are transferable to many universities beyond the school which transcripts it. However, it is up to each university to decide whether they accept the credits as 'subject area' or 'elective'. It is easy to check the reciprocity agreement online to determine how college credit would be accepted.
